# Announcing of Swimming Events 

Mission, Goals and Objectives

## Mission

The Announcer should be instrumental in making the swimming competition of the World Championships, Olympic Games or other FINA events a smooth, functioning, integrated event. The announcing should be done in a manner befitting these prestigious events.

## Goals:

to be impartial with regard to national representation.

* To be informative.
* To generate enthusiasm for the athletes.

To assume a guidance role in the event of a disaster.

## Objectives:

For the races:
To inform the audience of:

* Event about to be contested
* World, World Championships and Olympic Records
* Competitors and their lane assignments
* World or Olympic Record splits, if available
* Give names of relay swimmers as they are swimming

For each race:
Impartially solicit spectator enthusiasm

For the Victory Ceremony : To announce:
The Presenters

* The script prepared by the Ceremonies Committed

In case of disaster, to:

* Calm the crowd
* Give directions to the audience

## Instructions:

1.1 make sure that the sound system is working properly
1.2 obtain managers' names before competition begins in case the manager has to be called
1.3 use correct country names and abbreviations, check with protocol
1.4 ask about and verify questionable pronunciations
1.5 have the full event lists and approved scripts ready
1.6 make sure national anthems are ready to be played on cue
1.7 allow time for bursts of cheering and applause
1.8 do not talk between the time the whistle is blown and the starting signal is given, except where necessary, to quiet the audience if requested by the Referee
1.9 all disqualifications must be announced as soon as possible
1.10 announce the results of the last final event before announcing the next event
1.11 call the Referee as soon as possible, if there is any problem
1.12 the microphone must be turned off except when making announcements
1.13 generate enthusiasm during the race by objectively and enthusiastically arousing the crowd to 'bring on the swimmers'
1.14 be familiar with emergency exit procedures for the entire pool area
1.15 carefully follow the approved script, an example of which follows:

## SAMPLE HEATS SESSION SCRIPT <br> NOTE see sample event for full announcing presentation

Welcome Good morning ladies and gentlemen. The International Olympic Committee and FINA, the International Swimming Federation join your host, the Sydney Organising Committee for the Olympic Games (SOCOG), in welcoming you to this the (opening, $2^{\text {nd }}, 3^{\text {rd }}$ closing etc) Preliminary session of the swimming events of the XXV11th Olympic Games.

Events Preliminary Heats will be conducted in the following order (name schedule of events).

Qualifying The fastest sixteen swimmers in each event, 50, 100, 200 m based on the times they record this morning, will be the semi-finalists of the World Championship / Olympic Games. The fastest eight swimmers in all other events based on the times they record this morning, will be the finalists of the World Championships / Olympic Games.

Event Intro The ( $1^{\text {st, }} 2^{\text {nd }}, 3^{\text {rd }}, \ldots$ last) event to be conducted this morning will be the (men's / women's) (distance) metre (stroke). There will be ... preliminary heats of this event.
